The Celebrant continues

In the fullness of time bring us, with James and all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

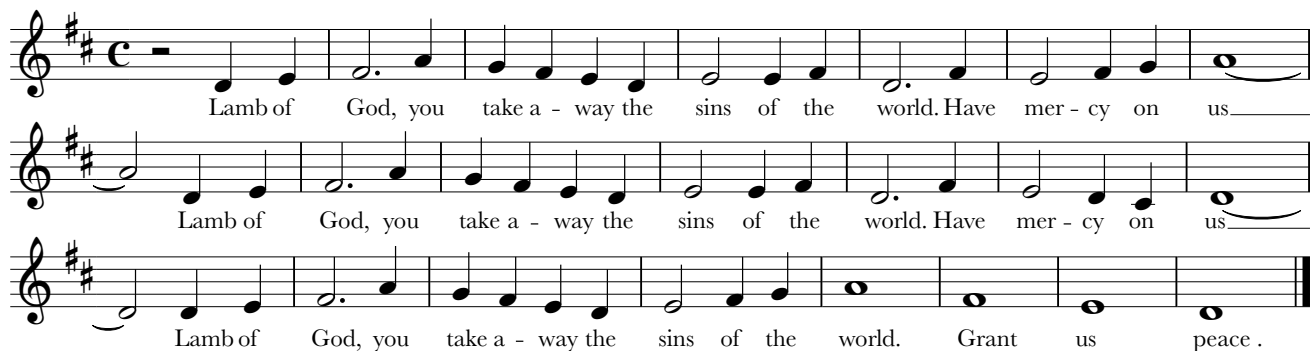
Breaking of the Bread

*Music notes: G. T. Thalben-Ball (1896 - 1987) and Everett Titcomb (1884 - 1968) were Anglican musicians in the early 20th century. Though born in Australia, Thalben-Ball served as organist/choirmaster at Temple Church in London for 60 years. His Elegy was played at the funeral of Diana of Princess of Wales. Titcomb served as organist/choirmaster at the notable Episcopal Church of St. John the Evangelist in Boston, Massachusetts for 49 years. Jeremy Banks serves as Director of music at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Dublin, Ohio.
