Acolytes are an important part of the service, as they assist the clergy in preparing for Communion.

Altar Guild

St. James' Altar Guild is a dedicated group of women and men who prepare the church for Sunday worship, as well as special services such as weddings and funerals. Serving on Altar Guild gives you the opportunity to learn more about Episcopal liturgy and, perhaps even more important, get to know each other better. Altar Guild is an essential, behind-the-scenes ministry necessary to make sure each service is ready from filling the candles to setting the communion table. The Altar Guild consists of four teams, each led by a chairperson/team leader.

Each team is responsible for one weekend of services per month and usually meets on Saturday morning to set up for the Sunday 7:30 a.m. service, but alternate times for set up can be arranged. Members also set and clean up after one Sunday service. St. James' needs altar guild members willing to come throughout Sunday to cover all services, and substitutes are available. Committees share responsibility for Christmas and Holy Week to accommodate members' family and work obligations and travel. Each team has "seasoned members" who guide those who are still learning. Altar Guild provides flexible schedules. Join Us!

Time required: 45 minutes to 1 hour – one Saturday morning per month (or an alternate time before Sunday morning) and 15 to 30 minutes – one Sunday morning per month.

Total: No more than 90 minutes each month. Additional service may be needed, as members are available, to set and clean up after occasional services during the week, such as weddings or funerals.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS, LECTORS, & READERS OF PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Love to read or speak to an audience? St. James' has tons of opportunities throughout the year for those who enjoy speaking in public. Lay people will serve on Sunday morning, reading the scripture lessons or prayers of the people. Readings will be assigned ahead of time. When full communion is restored, Eucharistic ministers (chalice bearers) are utilized at all in-person worship. These individuals must be trained & licensed. Training will be provided as needed.

Serving as both chalice and reader at a service would help tremendously. The goal is to provide a very flexible schedule. The more people we have make this job a whole lot easier on everyone. Youth are also able to be a part of this ministry

Time required: Once or twice a month during one service. Special skills needed: Excellent reader skills, understanding of this ministry's importance, responsibility to serve or find a substitute.

Special skills needed: Adults or youth who have completed the 5th grade and who are dependable and attentive. Training manual, training sessions, and mentoring will be provided. Not as hard as it sounds!

Clearly ushers are the face of St. James'! There is nothing more important than greeting everyone who enters the red doors on Sunday mornings, with the warmth and love of God. St. James' ALWAYS needs two people (or a family) to usher at all services on Sunday morning: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 10:45 a.m. Additionally, ushers are required at funerals or special programs. This j ob i ncludes g reeting, d istributing bulletins, counting people in attendance, guiding communion flow and a brief clean up. Instruction is always provided.

The St. James' Audio Visual Technology department, led by Michael Larkin, Director of Contemporary Music and Technology ensures set up, sound quality both in-side the church and virtually, and visual live-streaming including the creation of state-of-the-art videos.

The St. James' Tech Team can use as volunteers to learn part or all of the jobs that make online worship possible. Advancing slides, sound mixing, and live-stream monitoring are all areas that can utilize volunteers. Although some experience with audio engineering or videography is welcome, we are open to individuals who simply have great active listening skills, are comfortable with tablets and smartphones, and ideally have some experience as a musician (even if you're not a professional).

Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministry enhances the outreach by creating a "caring ministry explosion" where many, instead of a few, are offering God's love and care in intentional, systematic ways. Extensively trained people offer confidential, weekly, one-on-one care to those dealing with illness, loss, or other difficulties. COOKING/BAKING

Making and delivering meals to those in need is an incredible gift. It may seem small, however so many struggle with life's challenges that preparing a warm,

nutritious meal is often neglected. If you enjoy cooking or just hanging out, these ministries are for you!

Martha's

This fun and lively group prepare meals for individuals and families suffering from illness, loss, or just temporarily unable to cook for themselves. The food is prepared, packaged, labeled with a prayer, a list of contents, and stored in the church freezer. You don't even have to be a great cook. There are lots of jobs such as shopping, set up, and clean up. Everyone works together. The Martha's meet on a week day morning for 2 or 3 hours.

Time required: The Martha's divide up the responsibilities, shop for the food, make labels, and gather in the parish hall kitchen to stock the freezer. Usually meet once a month, during the day.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Cayuga County Jail Ministry

Ellen Kulik and Cindy Bright are members of an Ecumenical Jail Ministry at the Cayuga County Jail, located on County House Road in Auburn. Teams of 2 visit the men and women at the jail to offer prayer, song, support, devotionals, and study of the Bible. Our goal in visiting the incarcerated men and women is to offer the presence of Christ to them. Besides their GED program, our group meetings are the only programming available at the jail. The goal is to help them turn towards the Lord and move towards recovery.

Opportunities:

• We need more volunteers willing to visit the men at the jail. Currently we have only one female volunteer visiting the men.

• We are looking for people willing to serve as a pen pal with men and women incarcerated at the jail who are lonely and have very few visitors. You will only share your first name with the inmates. Guidelines will be provided.

Time Commitment Required: 30-60 minutes every 1-2 weeks.

Talents or Interests Helpful: For Pen Pals: Letter writing (hand written or typed), empathy, desire to reach out to those in need. For visitors: Ability to suspend judgment; and willingness to pray out loud with others and lead discussion about the Bible, faith, and struggles.

AUBURN RESCUE MISSION

A year-long discernment process in 2015 led St. James' to identify three areas of vulnerability in which St. James' is called by God to serve. These areas are: affordable housing, mental health and supporting youth locally. Putting these into action, St. James' is partnering with the Auburn Rescue Mission. As Christians, we are asked to be followers of Jesus. That is done not only at Sunday worship, but in everyday life in our community as well. It is good to be continually asking ourselves and this Church how we all can serve Christ in the community around us.

Time required: approximately 1 hours.

Talents or Interests Helpful: A desire to be open to God's calling as to how we can serve those in need in our community.



With the partnership St. James' has with the Auburn Rescue Mission, there is an opportunity to engage the tenants of the Merriman Circle neighborhood in Auburn. The tenants are in a situation where they have recently come out of homelessness and are living in the Merriman Circle neighborhood in an attempt to learn life skills transitioning to a new life.

ST. JAMES' THRIFT SHOP

This amazing little shop has been serving the community for over 50 years. It is completely run by volunteers. Donations come from the community, volunteers take in the merchandise, price it, organize it and sell it! The Thrift Shop also provides clothing for those in need at no cost. All funds raised at the shop are put back into the business or given to St. James' ministries to help fund the work of God. Donations are accepted on Monday and Tuesday between the house of 10 a.m. -1 p.m. Shop retail hours are on Wednesdays–Saturdays 10 a.m. -4 p.m. The St. James' Thrift Shop is open on Sundays only through the Dickens Christmas Season. There is a shortage of volunteers due to covid who are willing to work during the retail times. Each shift is only 3 hours and if you could give of your time, cashiers or assistants to the cashiers are truly needed especially during holiday times. The St. James'Thrift Shop takes both cash and credit cards now! It is all very basic and easy! Training is available and responsible youth are more than welcome to work with an adult. If you love to work with the community and be a part of the bustling downtown Skaneateles life, this is the volunteer opportunity for you.

Due to the large number and diverse logistics required, Rev. Becky Coerper requires assistance to make each wedding both special and organized. Each wedding at St. James' requires a wedding assistant to help interface with the photographers, videographers and families. The assistant is at both the rehearsal and wedding from set up to close up. Also, greeters/ushers are needed to help inform guests of safety protocols, hand out bulletins, answer questions and be the "face" of St. James'. Greeters only need to attend for the beginning of the rehearsal & wedding service. Weddings are throughout the year and volunteers can choose the ones that work for their schedule. YOUTH & CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



St. James' Children's Ministry is in the process of transitioning to include different programs. The nursery will remain as a room for families to use if they would like. 
