Meet 11 year old Adhara Pérez Sánchez from Mexico City. Sanchez has autism and has an IQ of 162 which is higher than Albert Einstein and Stephan Hawking. (To give you perspective, having an IQ score that falls between 85-115 is considered within the average range) Sánchez

has already obtained a degree in systems engineering from CNCI University and an industrial engineering degree with a specialization in mathematics from the



Technological University of Mexico. Sánchez graduated from elementary school at the age of five and completed middle and high school in just one year. Her mom noticed that at a young age she had memorized the periodic table and even taught herself algebra. Due to bullying from students and lack of intervention from teachers she changed schools three times and became depressed. Sánchez has experienced many obstacles that she has had to overcome but her goal is to become an astronaut with NASA. "When Love is the Way" Griot Vanessa Johnson to speak at the dedication of St. James' community quilt-June 11 at 12pm

Griot Vanessa Johnson, fiber artist, activist and storyteller in the West African tradition, will present "Loving Neighbors" beginning at noon, June 11, 2023, at St. James'. Johnson's story-tell will highlight the dedication and celebration of "Neighbor Love," St. James' community quilt. Light refreshments will be served. The event is open to the public.

The community quilt project was conceived by St. James' Racial Justice and Reconciliation Commission. Planning for the concept and design of the quilt began a year ago when 10

women from St. James' gathered in the church conference room to brainstorm the meaning of agape love and how that love is carried out by our congregation. Inspired by Jesus' command to "Love your neighbor," the group worked to create a nine-block quilt with images that evoke the many ministries in which the people of St. James' are involved.



In addition to story telling, Johnson is a writer, playwright, actor and museum consultant. She served on the Syracuse Juneteenth Committee and coordinated the annual festival at the Southwest Center in Syracuse for three years, creating and directing the "Juneteenth Interactive Museum" for 5 years. This will be an event for the ages.

Currently, Johnson is the Matilda Joslyn Gage Foundation women's rights center's Artist in Residence. As a consultant for the museum, she designed the Underground Railroad Room, and was trained in Dialogue Facilitation for the museum's Community Dialogue Program on Reproductive Rights ("Who Chooses?"). The most recent exhibition of her work, "Straddling Oceans," was at the Community Folk Art Gallery in Syracuse, March 20 through May 6.






A Prayer for Memorial Day

Transition News & Updates

Over the past few weeks, there have been several announcements about changes and news regarding the transition time after Rev. Becky leaves and the interim clergy begins. Here are some of the highlights.

- 1. All transition news can be found on StJamesSkan.org/transition. The link is found on a large section on the home page below the rotating banners.
- 2. Justin Oei (pronounced We) is St. James' new Organist/Choirmaster who will be joining the staff on August 1st. He will be meeting with the choir and Kip on June 1 for introductions and tours of the church.
- 3. Laura Posecznick is now the Interim Chief of Staff until a new interim rector is on board.
- 4. Beginning May 28, St. James' will be using one bulletin for both the 9am & 10:45am services. Follow the content on the left side for the 9am worship and the right side for the 10:45am service. The content you find in the middle is common to both. This may take a bit to readjust but it will save paper, time, and potential errors. There will continue to be screens used during the 9am worship.
- 5. St. James' has clergy and music coverage for the entire summer. Be sure to join worship each week and hear the inspirational words from Rev. Dr. Chuck Stewart, the Rev. Dr. Jim Corl, and Bishop Skip Adams.
- 6. On Sunday, May 21, Rev. Becky Coerper shared the Covenant of Understanding Upon the Departure of Clergy which she has signed and will follow. This document can be found on the welcome tables as well as on the Transition webpage on StJamesSkan.org. It is vital for the congregation understand that while Rev. Becky will always love and cherish the St. James' family, she is giving us the space to form strong bonds with the new incoming clergy. In order to do this, Rev. Becky will not be able to come back to St. James' for one year after the new permanent rector is in place and then only with permission. All pastoral requests must now go through the St. James' Pastoral Team and future clergy. Any questions regarding this important document, please contact the Parish Office or speak with Rev. Becky Coerper before June 4
- 7. The Vestry is in the process of interviewing an Interim Rector. The process is moving right along.
- 8. Lakeside Worship at 10:45am will begin on June 11. Rev. Canon Tom Ferguson from the Diocese will be preaching and celebrating on June 11.
