Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

Clergy The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. The Nicene Creed
