We will be guided on our tour of the historic canal by John Kenny, owner of Canal Side Experiences, 706 Waterloo Geneva Road, Waterloo, NY (about a 30-minute drive from St. James Church). The tour is a program of the Erie CanalWay National Heritage Corridor, designed to get New Yorkers out on the water to enjoy the canal system and the beauty of nature.

Did You Know? By Emma Cowley

Although the Olympics primarily emphasize sports, they also serve as a platform for countries to showcase their cultural history, identity, and values. The 2024 Paris Olympics opening ceremony uniforms and their cultural significance:

Mongolia: Their uniforms feature detailed vests embroidered with elements like Soyombo symbol and the mythological Gua-Maral deer. These uniforms which took around 20 hours to make symbolize their nomadic heritage with traditional patterns and motifs inspired by their history. Haiti: Haiti's skirt and trousers are pattern with a painting from local artist Philippe Dodard, symbolizing "the rebirth of the first Black Republic", the designer said. The men wear jackets inspired by Guayabera shirts, a homage to the signature Haitian look.

Mexico: Mexico, uniform, speech or pink and white colors with sleeve prints inspired by the cities of Oaxaca, San Miguel de Allende and and Michoc'an. The black shirt pays homage to El 'Angel, a monument that commemorates Mexico's War of Independence centennial.

Chinese Taipei: these Taylor two piece suits blend sustainability with the crafts of local artisans. The uniforms belt and shoe uppers were made by a local artisan with banana fiber woven fabric, while the lapel pins, which are made up of Taiwan's natural flowers, were crafted by a flower-weaving artisan.

Czech Republic: the uniform features are striking blue and white trench coat inspired by the Czech "bal0na'k" coat, which is meant to honor the host country.

Sri Lanka: Sri Lanka's uniforms are made of silk and other natural materials, featuring designs that pay homage to the country's traditional clothing culture. The uniforms feature hand -made embroidery and beadwork inspired by the attire of the 19th century royal court.

Each Summer at St. James' we take time to clear the cobwebs, dust, vacuum, and wash down both inside and outside to be ready for September kick off. Blessedly, St. James' has a lot more traffic this summer with the addition of Play to Learn, BlueBird Music and STEM for kids. Help the Skaneateles Ecumenical Food Pantry by dropping off an item or two. Always needed: canned black beans, 32-oz. containers of vegetable oil, cereal (especially Captain Crunch), 100% fruit juice, and canned fruit (any kind, including applesauce). White rice (not instant) is especially needed right now. 2-pound bags of rice are often available at dollar stores for \$1.25. SAFE CHURCH TRAINING

Each year, the CNY Diocese encourages churches to review their databases to be sure everyone (clergy, worship participants, vestry, staff, and volunteers) are all up-to-date on Safe Church Training. Over the last few years, training has been moved to online modules you can access and complete at your own pace at home. That is still an option. However, now onsite training is available. St. James' will be holding a **Safe**

Church Training here in the Parish Hall on Sunday, August 11 and September 29 from

1-5pm. Soon, you should be receiving notification from Laura Posecznick to let you know if you need to complete training or re-certify. While this training is not how anyone wishes to spend their day-it is VITAL to the health and safety of our church and required for the yearly audit. It does last for 5 years! If you require safe church training for your ministry area, please let Laura Posecznick know if you wish to train online or inperson.
