The People remain standing as the Presider recalls God's work in creation and humanity's fall and the redemption of the world by Christ.

After recalling Christ's Last Supper, the Presider and People pray:

Presider Great is the Mystery of Faith:
All **Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.**

The Presider prays that the gifts and People may be blessed and sanctified by God. When the Presider concludes the prayer, the People loudly respond, "AMEN!"

Presider And now, let us pray the prayer our Lord Jesus taught us:
All **Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Presider Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People **Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!**

The Presider invites the People to share in the Communion of our Lord. All who desire a deeper relationship with Christ are welcome to receive. If you do not wish to receive, you may come forward for a Blessing.

Please move forward and create a line. Receive the Bread from the Presider. If you wish to drink from the Cup, consume the Bread and move to the Minister holding the silver Chalice. To have intinction, keep the Bread flat in your hand and move to the Minister with the glass Chalice, who will dip the Bread in the Wine and place it back in your hand.

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you need Communion brought to you, please let an usher or Lakeside Crew member know. During Communion, Prayer Ministers are available to pray with anyone who is in need.

The Liturgy of Leavetaking

Presider Beloved in Christ, on the 3rd of September, the 14th Sunday after Pentecost, in the year of our Lord 2023, I was welcomed into St. James' Church as your Interim Rector. I have, with God's help, and to the best of my abilities, exercised this trust, accepting its privileges and responsibilities. I have been blessed during this time to walk with you as you have moved through grief, adjusted to new ways of being the Church, told your stories, discerned who you are, and faithfully called your next Rector, The Reverend Pilar F. Holy Scripture teaches us that to everything there is a season. Be with us as we go our separate ways to live and speak your praise in the world, always bound together by the Holy Spirit and the communion of your saints. This we pray in the loving, liberating, and life-giving name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**
