Survivor to discuss enduring legacy of Indian Residential Schools

St. James' Racial Justice and Reconciliation Commission presents "A Story of Trauma and Healing," with special guest Virgil Brave Rock, a member of the Blackfeet Nation and a social worker on the Onondaga Nation, located near Syracuse, NY. **The presentation will be held Oct. 20 at 12:15 p.m. in the St. James' Parish Hall and is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be served.**

Brave Rock was just six years old when he was sent to Saint Mary's Residential School on Blood Reserve in Alberta, Canada. Indigenous children at the

residential boarding schools were stripped of their names and assigned numbers. They were forbidden to speak their native language, wear traditional clothing or to talk about their homes and culture. Brave Rock has spent years healing from the trauma and will share his story.

Saint Mary's school opened in 1926. By the mid-1930s, the school was overcrowded. Conditions were horrific and a government inspector noted that the boys at both the Catholic and Anglican residential schools on the reserve worked like slaves from morning to night to support the schools. An outbreak of measles was documented in 1935 and of spinal meningitis in 1956. The Canadian government took over the school in 1969 and closed it in 1988 (information from the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, University of Manitoba).

In addition to the schools located in Canada, there were more than 523 government-funded and often church-run Indian Boarding Schools across the United States between 1869 and the 1960s. Children were forcibly taken from their homes and sent to these schools under a U.S. policy intended to commit cultural genocide through the removal and reprogramming of American Indian and Alaska Native children. The stated purpose of the policy was to "Kill the Indian, Save the Man" (The National Native American Boarding School Healing Coalition).

Mother Pilar will celebrate weekly at 12pm & the service will be live-streamed!

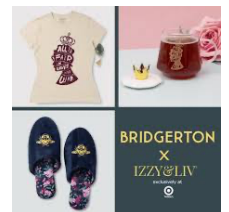
