Safe and Warm, our lunch making and delivering project to the homeless in motels in Cayuga County is celebrating one year of weekly deliveries on Friday afternoons. It has grown from 50 meals to 150 plus additional sandwiches per week. The lunches now include two fruits and a cheese stick along with PBJ's. We also distribute personal care items, warm winter hats and gloves and feminine sanitary supplies, because these products are not covered by any checks these families receive.

You're Invited to Celebrate 75 Years of the St. James' Thrift Shop!



Here are some great new Black TV shows to be watching.

Harlem (Prime Video): A comedy series that follows four ambitious friends in New York City as they navigate love, careers, and personal growth.

Clean Slate (Prime Video): A sitcom featuring Laverne Cox as Desiree, a trans woman who returns to her Alabama hometown to reconnect with her estranged father, Harry, played by George Wallace. The series explores their evolving

relationship with humor and heart.

Paradise (Hulu): A thriller starring Sterling K. Brown as Xavier Collins, a Secret Service agent investigating the murder of former President Cal Bradford in the town of Paradise. The show intertwines personal and political intrigue.

With Love, Meghan (Netflix): A lifestyle series where Meghan, Duchess of Sussex, shares cooking, gardening, and hosting tips from her California home, aiming to inspire viewers to find joy in everyday activities.

Watson (CBS): A medical drama that follows Dr. John Watson, played by Morris Chestnut, as he leads a clinic specializing in rare disorders after Sherlock Holmes' presumed death. Though he tries to move on, Watson is pulled back into mystery when new evidence suggests Moriarty may still be alive. The show blends medical cases with detective elements.

As she searches for answers, she uncovers secrets linked to her father's unsolved murder. The series is full of suspense, twists, and emotional drama.

Dope Thief (Apple TV+): A crime drama featuring Brian Tyree Henry as Ray, who, along with his friend Manny, scams drug dealers by posing as DEA agents. Their scheme escalates when they target a dangerous syndicate, putting their lives at risk.
