

Did You Know? Hispanic Heritage Month is a month-long observance honoring the rich history, diverse cultures, and lasting contributions of Hispanic and Latino communities. While their impact is recognized year-round, from September 15 to October 15, we take special time to celebrate their influence on the fabric of the United States – from vibrant art and traditional foods to powerful advocacy and community leadership. This month offers an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the profound role Latinas and Latinos have played in shaping American society. The Latino presence in what is now the United States goes back centuries, even before Spanish colonization. Hispanic Americans have contributed to every chapter of our nation's history – including the Revolutionary War – and became more deeply integrated into the U.S. through historical events like the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo and the Treaty of Paris, which followed the Mexican-

American and Spanish-American Wars. These treaties brought regions such as the American Southwest and Puerto Rico under U.S. governance, further expanding Hispanic American communities. Today, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, more than 60 million Latinos live in the United States, making up 18.9% of the total population – the largest ethnic or racial minority in the country. Latino Americans continue to drive innovation, culture, and growth across all areas of society – as entrepreneurs, scientists, public servants, entertainers, athletes, and more.
