With the federal government entering a shut down, we are preparing for increased demand for food at our local food banks due to the elimination of SNAP benefits and other federal programming. To help support our beloved brothers and sisters for whom food scarcity is a real concern, the vestry has decided to take up a special plate offering for the next four Sundays to support the Skaneateles Food Pantry and the Food Bank of Central New York. You can place your offering in an envelope and write "Rector's Discretionary" on it or write it in the memo line on a check, placing it in the offering plate. This is one way we can live into being the church. Seventy years ago, before the federal government made changes to fund social programming and benefits, it was the church that made sure people were housed, clothed, and fed. This is an opportunity for us to live into our calls at baptism and we are grateful for your generosity.

# Vote Tuesday, Nov. 4, 6 a.m.- 9 p.m. (Onondaga County) for Local Elections

Every registered voter is eligible to vote. Be sure to check on where your voting station is located. It could have changed. Never assume. Since you have to provide multiple forms of ID to be registered, NYS does not require you to provide one at the polls. HOWEVER, it makes things easier for the inspectors looking you up & if you registered by mail-you will be required to show your license before you can vote. Your address on your ID must match what is on file or you will have to do an affidavit ballot which is longer. Local elections decide how your town or village will be run. In some cases, it is more important than the national election. Do you homework, read up on who is running for office. Questions, contact the Board of Elections in your county.

# **Did You Know? By Emma Cowley**



Midori Monét, a Black trans woman from the U.S., was crowned Miss International Queen 2025 in Thailand, making history as the first Black trans woman and first Black contestant from any nation to win the title. She is also the third American to ever claim the crown. Originally from Tacoma, Washington, and now based in Seattle, Monét's journey to the international stage began long before this historic win. She earned the national title of Miss International Queen USA 2025, and notably competed in cisgender pageants as well—placing among the top finalists at Miss Washington USA, a rare feat for a trans woman. Alongside her pageantry, Monét is a dedicated advocate for LGBTQ+ youth. She cofounded The House of Scott, a chosen-family network providing mentorship and community for queer youth, particularly those facing marginalization. On the Miss International Queen stage, she also won Best National Costume and Best Preliminary Performance, showcasing

both her artistry and presence. In her acceptance speech, she declared she was "living out [her] ancestors' wildest dreams," underscoring the importance of visibility, representation, and pride—especially for Black trans women who are too often underrepresented and underserved. Her win is being celebrated worldwide as a groundbreaking moment for diversity in pageantry and a powerful symbol of hope and progress.
