

Downtown Syracuse has a new reason to satisfy its sweet tooth with the opening of Sweets for Babe, a dessert shop specializing in small-batch banana pudding and fresh cold-pressed juices. Tucked into the lower level of the McCarthy Mercantile at 217 S Salina Street, this cozy new addition blends Southern comfort with a modern twist. Owner Nikki Poles, originally from Trinidad, launched in April 2025, Sweets for Babe is already gaining attention for its focus on high-quality ingredients and classic, nostalgic flavors. Their signature banana pudding, crafted in small batches, is at the heart of the menu, offering a rich, creamy taste that channels homemade goodness. The shop's minimalist setup allows the desserts to take center stage, offering a casual yet stylish space for a quick treat or a relaxed break. In addition to pudding, the menu includes cold-pressed juices, adding a refreshing balance to the sweet offerings. As part of the revitalization of downtown Syracuse's food scene, Sweets for Babe stands out for its commitment to quality and its focus on a niche-Southern-inspired desserts-that's both comforting and unique. With convenient hours and a prime location, it's poised to become a go-to spot for locals and visitors alike.
